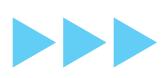

Norbrook's Founder: The Lord Ballyedmond

A Visionary Entrepreneur in Animal Health

Edward Haughey, later known as The Lord Ballyedmond, was born in County Louth, Ireland, and showed an entrepreneurial spirit from an early age. In 1969, driven by a vision to transform animal healthcare, he founded Norbrook Laboratories in Northern Ireland. With limited animal health options available at the time, Lord Ballyedmond saw an opportunity to provide high-quality, affordable products to improve animal well-being. His commitment to innovation and excellence quickly positioned Norbrook as an industry leader, with its first patent secured just five years later.

Today, Norbrook's pioneering solutions continue to expand access to essential animal healthcare worldwide.

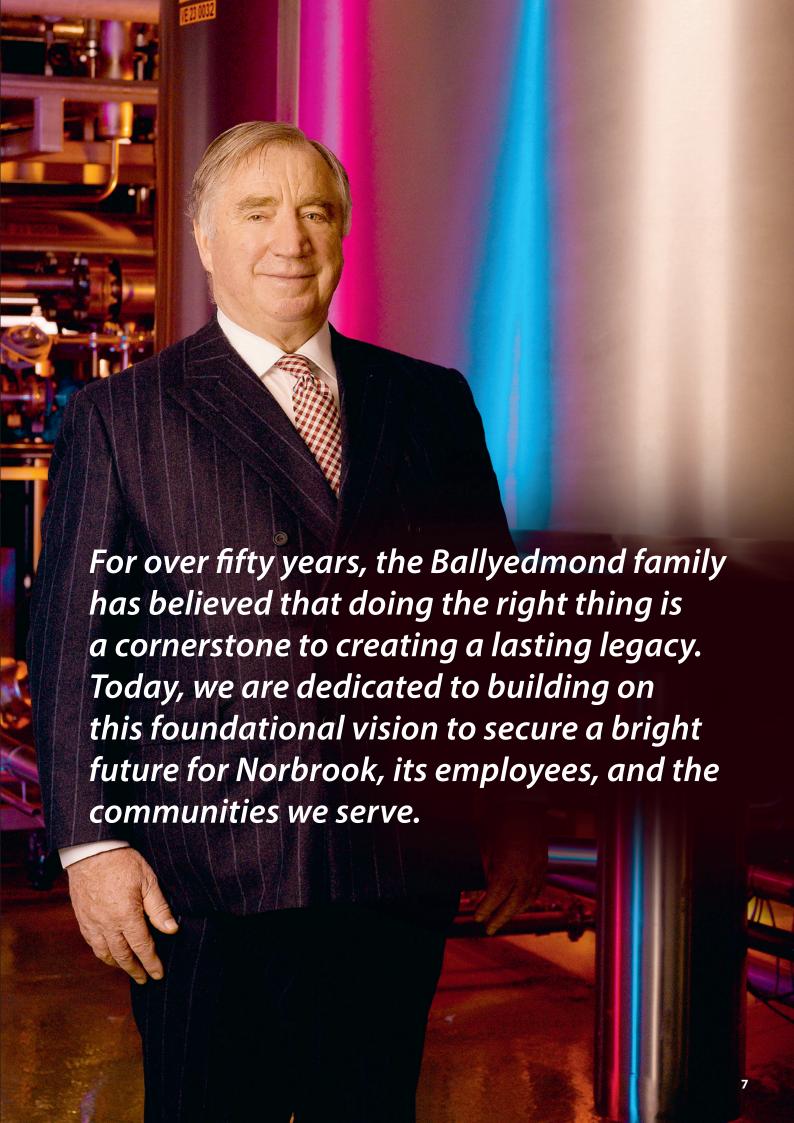

WeCare@Christmas: a growing tradition of generosity

The WeCare@Christmas programme has seen remarkable growth and has made a significant difference in our local community in Newry, Northern Ireland, where Norbrook was established over fifty years ago. In Christmas 2023, we distributed over 1,000 hampers in the Newry area, providing essential supplies and festive cheer to those in need.

Our efforts extended to preparing over 3,000 hot meals for individuals facing food insecurity and hosting a festive afternoon for more than 240 local elderly residents, complete with a special meal prepared by our dedicated staff.

The **WeCare** programme played a vital role in supporting both our employees and the broader community society. We assembled and delivered **WeCare** hampers

filled with food, magazines, books, and activities, to colleagues who were shielding at home. Partnering with Newry, Mourne & Down Council, we also reached out to families in need throughout the region, spreading hope and support during challenging times.

The programme's success is largely due to the increased involvement of our employees. In 2024, 500 employees volunteered 1,800



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hours of their time towards our CSR initiatives. This growth allowed us to expand our support to various local charities, including Women's Aid, St. Vincent De Paul, Larder, Bolster, Homestart, Simon Community, Kilkeel Development Association, Surestart Newry, and Surestart South Armagh. Our collaborations with these organisations and the local council have maximised the benefits for those in need, enhancing our community's well-being, increasing the impact of our actions.

Jajja Flora Orphanage

Kingothua Primary School

Donations from our employees facilitated the construction of a new kitchen and dining facility at Kingothua Primary School, located near our Kenyan factory. This development supports better nutrition and a more conducive learning environment for the students.

Kawaida Care & Feeding Centre

Kawaida, a community-based project in Kenya, provides vital support to orphaned children and those from impoverished families. Our contributions have funded the creation of a new classroom, kitchen, water tank for rainwater collection, and a playground, enhancing the centre's ability to care for and educate the children.

Through a reliable supply of essential veterinary medicines, we deliver value to farmers across Kenya and Uganda, even in remote areas, to help them combat critical challenges like ticks and tick-borne diseases, which cause

significant livestock mortality and spread harmful pathogens. We choose to innovate and evolve our product portfolio to address this issue and provide effective solutions for local farmers. We continue to offer extensive educational programmes to empower veterinarians and livestock farmers to make informed and commercially sound decisions.

In addition to developing innovative products, we are committed to educating farmers on the significance of product rotation to mitigate tick resistance and promote the long-term health of their livestock, which in turn sustains their livelihoods. Our teams actively engage with customers through ongoing educational workshops to ensure the correct and responsible use of veterinary products. 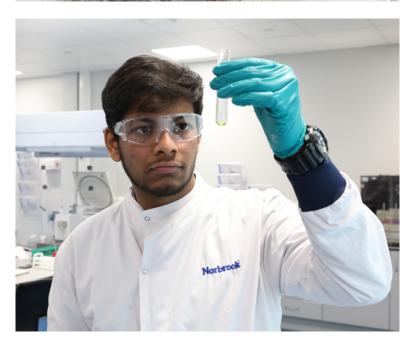

We enable veterinarians, farmers and pet owners alike to deliver the best care for their animals by offering affordable, high-quality solutions. We believe that by staying at the forefront of innovation, we can have an enduring impact on sustainable animal healthcare, benefiting our customers, our communities, and the environment.

Our approval by the U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA), European Medicines Agency (EMA) and U.K. Veterinary Medicines Directorate (VMD) stands as a testament to the stringent standards we uphold. In 2024, Norbrook continued to invest in innovation. Felanorm® (methimazole) Oral Solution was launched in the USA, a revolutionary oral treatment for hyperthyroidism in cats, and the first product of its kind to be approved by the Federal Drug Administration (FDA).

Norbrook also opened a newly upgraded sterile injectable manufacturing suite, home to products critical in the treatment and prevention of infections in livestock and pets. This project represents a GBP1.3million investment and ensures compliance with the most up to date EU guidelines for the manufacture of sterile medicinal products.

Reducing Waste and Implementing Carbon Reduction Initiatives

At Norbrook, we recognise that our customers share our passion for reducing waste and finding innovative ways to minimise our carbon footprint. Through responsible waste management and carbon offsetting, we strive to make some real strides towards a more sustainable future.

Our dry waste is handled by expert partners who collect and process materials at specialised recycling facilities. Here, mixed recyclables are carefully sorted, separated, and forwarded for recovery, where they can re-enter the market as valuable resources, cutting down the need for virgin materials. Thanks to these efforts, only 2% of our waste ends up in landfill, a significant achievement that also supports our customers' sustainability goals.

For the non-recyclable waste, we have introduced two groundbreaking processes to divert it from landfill. The first process focuses on fines separation, where smaller materials are sent to the ARP facility for recycling and recovery. The second process transforms non-recyclable materials into solid recovered fuel (SRF), which is used by the cement industry as a cleaner alternative to traditional fossil fuels. These processes contribute to a greener energy transition that our customers can rely on by reducing

landfill use and methane emissions and lowering the demand for oil, coal, and gas.

Since 2016, our commitment to sustainability has driven a 63% reduction in our carbon emissions. In 2023, we processed close to 770 tonnes of waste, leading to a carbon offset of approximately 580m³. Additionally, close to 3000 tonnes of waste were processed through our Aggregate Recovery Facility, resulting in a further carbon reduction of over 1700m³.

We are proud of the installation of effluent treatment plants at our manufacturing sites in Newry. These plants treat 100% of our effluent waste, ensuring we handle wastewater responsibly and protect the local environment from pollution. We are reducing the environmental impact on surrounding ecosystems and contributing to cleaner water by treating our waste on-site.

We have extended our commitment to reducing resource consumption to our annual steam trap surveys and maintenance programmes. By regularly inspecting and maintaining these systems, we have successfully reduced our steam usage by 15%. This proactive approach conserves energy, reduces emissions, and ensures our systems are running at peak efficiency.

of who we are. For over fifty years, we have continually explored ways to reduce our energy consumption and environmental impact, ensuring a brighter, greener future for everyone.

Across our sites in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland, 80% of all lighting is now energy-efficient LED, equipped with motion detection controls. This shift has led to an 80% reduction in electricity used for lighting. Not only does this save energy, but it also reduces our carbon footprint and creates a more comfortable and responsive environment for our teams. We are continuously looking at how we can improve on our efforts, so within the

next year, we are upgrading more lights in our head office, with another 100 LED fittings set to deliver even more energy savings.

To ensure we are only using energy when needed, we have introduced presence detectors (PIRs), which automatically turn off lighting in unoccupied spaces. Additionally, all compressors in Newry and Monaghan have been converted to Variable Speed Drive (VSD) technology, cutting electricity use by 40%.

In warmer months, one of our key manufacturing sites uses a central Sea Water (SW) chilled water system, enhanced with cooling towers, helping us achieve a 50% reduction in energy use for cooling. We have installed energy-efficient HVAC systems with heat recovery, during our recent lab and office upgrades, reducing electricity consumption by 20%.

By investing in electric vehicles, we are committed to providing our customers with eco-friendly solutions that contribute to cleaner air and a healthier planet. This commitment aligns with our vision of a greener future, where every choice we make supports both our business and the environment.

We minimise transportation emissions, reduce our environmental impact, and support local economies by making, testing and packing all our products within a 2km radius.

These energy-saving initiatives help us to operate more efficiently and they demonstrate our deep desire to reduce emmisions and foster a sustainable future because we believe that every small change adds up to a big impact, for the planet, and for generations to come.

Innovating Energy Management

As innovators, we are always looking for new ways to reduce our environmental impact, and our latest projects are making an exciting and tangible difference. By integrating technology and thoughtful management, we believe we are continuing to nudge the needle to create a more sustainable future for everyone.

One of our current initiatives is the use of the Suite 27 Building Management System (BMS) as a prototype for monitoring our utility meters. This system will allow us to track and trend energy readings in real time, giving us clearer insights into our consumption patterns. By the end of 2024, this tool will be up and running, helping us to identify areas for improvement and further reduce energy waste. We will be able to pass on the benefits of greater efficiency and sustainability to our customers, ensuring the products we offer are created with minimal environmental impact.

In addition, we are piloting the control of electricity consumption on a suite-by-suite basis. By tailoring energy usage to actual needs, we ensure that no power is wasted, bringing us one step closer to becoming a more energy-efficient operation.

This effort will lead to a decrease in energy consumption and a reduced carbon footprint and strengthens our ability to deliver responsibly produced products that meet our customers' growing sustainability expectations, all while maintaining a comfortable and efficient workspace for our employees.

We believe that our innovative nature will inspire our industry in how we approach sustainability to make a meaningful difference — for our business, our employees, and the planet we all share.





































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
